
### Please can you help out on the day?

In March this year, a path which had been used for years on the southern boundary of **Corfe Mullen** was closed, following a change in land ownership. An application for a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO) to add the route to the Definitive Map is being considered, therefore if anyone who has used this in the past would like to submit an evidence form, please contact me in the first instance.

The route which has been closed off is from the southern end of footpath E37/42 (A) to B as shown below. (South of B is Happy Bottom)



E37/42 and E37/4 are footpaths: the other line is the Dorset/BCP Unitary Boundary.

I was then 5 minutes late for an appointment. Please leave plenty of time to park if you are visiting Bournemouth Hospital by car.

Orders affecting changes to the following rights of way have been confirmed since DFN Issue 100. Definitive Map Modification Orders (DMMOs), and Public Path Orders (PPOs) being processed by Dorset Council, can be found here.

Long Term Temporary Closures/Diversions under Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984: Section 14(1) or 14/2 (unless otherwise stated) all are needed to comply with Health & Safety Regulations. **Allington FP9:** From 31.07.25, for 18 months. To allow for the

 $\int$  Vearse Farm housing development to take place. Symondsbury FPs 2,3,4,5,6,7 & 95:

On this occasion there is no alternative route.

Beaminster FP73 (part): From GR ST 4708 0155 to ST 4708 0166, from 23.06.25 for 26 weeks but may be extended with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport. To enable construction of a new development. Alt route.

**Bournemouth FPE41:** From 15.09.25 for 5 days. To facilitate sewer connection for development. Bridport FP81: From GR SY 4700 9428 to SY 4726 9420, from 08.09.25 for 26 weeks, but anticipated completion 02.01.26. To allow Wessex Water to carry out a sewer replacement. Alt route.

Ferndown FP30 (part): From GR SU 07378 00378 to SU 07314 00377, from 08.08.25 for 26 weeks, but completion anticipated 05.09.25. To allow the construction and installation of two new crossings along Church Road, Ferndown, and the widening of a new footpath in Millennium Park to connect the new crossing. No alternative.

Gillingham FP33: From 02.06.2025 for a period of 26 weeks, however it is anticipated the works will be completed by 27 June 2025. The Order is required to allow Redrow Homes Ltd to construct a new path

Gillingham FP78 (part): From GR ST 81926 25253 to ST 82043 25148, from 12.08.25 for 21 days, to allow the housing development to be built along with the permanent diversion routes. This is in conjunction with other temporary closures on these RoW.

**Shapwick BR11**: From GR ST 95498 01667 to ST 95204 00927, from 12.08.25 for 21 days. To allow fire/smoke abatement and removal of damaged asbestos from barn structure. No alt.

From GR ST 91497 03545 to ST 91420 03459, from **Spetisbury BR5:** Spetisbury FP2 (part): 16.08.25 (following two 21 day closures) for 26 weeks. **Tarrant Keyneston BR7:** To prevent users crossing the leet stream bridge that is

considered unsafe for Right of Way traffic. **Tarrant Keyneston FP14:** 

(Please Note: All the above closures are for Health and Safety reasons. Any person who uses or permits the use of the footpaths in contravention of any of the above orders will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £1,000.)
